HOW DOES A RECEIVER RUN THE DIFFERENT ROUTES?


FLAT ROUTE


A flat route is a three step, outside breaking route usually run from inside of the numbers breaking at a 90-degree angle.

03

CURL ROUTE

A curl route is when a receiver pushes up the field between a depth of 12 and 15 yards and breaking downhill at a 45-degree angle inside (or to the quarterback).

SLANT ROUTE

A slant route is a three step drop with an inside breaking concept where the receiver will use a quick, vertical stem before breaking at a 45-degree angle.

FADE ROUTE

A fade route can be identified with multiple terminology (go, fly, clear-out, hailmary). Using a vertical stem, the receiver will work to beat a defender's cushion in off-man and run straight down the field.
